Safe, sustainable and compliant waste disposal starts with segregation

Follow the Colour-coded Segregation System

CATEGORY	Non-infectious, non hazardous medicines	Infectious AND contaminated with medicine / chemicals	Infectious but not medicinally contaminated	Contaminated with cytotoxic or cytostatic medicine	Offensive, non-infectious waste
EXAMPLES	Surplus or time- expired medicines and pharmaceuticals including bottles and blister packs.	Infectious waste including needles and sharps contaminated with pharmaceuticals and Cat. A	Known infectious inc. Covid-19 soiled dressings, swabs, incontinence pads and PPE	Any waste contaminated with cytotoxic or cytostatic medications	Inc. non-infectious soiled dressings, swabs, vomit bowls, incontinence pads and PPE
